School-linked mental health services grants - to bring mental health clinics into the

Full-service community schools grants - brings wrap-around services into the school			
to support the whole person such as job training and dental care for both at-risk

Homework starts with home grant - to provide stable housing for students and their

Collaborative, the Minnesota Department of Education, Minnesota Housing, and the

Collaborative urban and greater Minnesota educators of color program grants - for

Grow Your Own pathways to teacher licensure - for school districts to establish

districts with over 25% or 30% students of color. An additional \$500,000 is reserved			
for districts to implement an introduction to teaching course to encourage students in
