

K-12 Conference Committee – House and Senate Offers

The Speaker of the House, Senate Majority Leader, and the Governor agreed to \$320 million annually in new funding for E-12 education, amounting to \$1 billion over the next three years. Although the House and Senate traded multiple offers, they could not agree. Between \$200 to \$265 million to fund the gap in special education funding, which would have benefited every student, was left on the table.

Senate Offer #1

- The offer came before the education target of \$300 million was announced. This Senate offer included only \$31 million for LETRS literacy training and literacy specialists at MDE's Regional Centers of Excellence.
